BOARD DISCUSSION:

*1. By-Laws and Rules of Procedures*

Mr. Grantner said Attorney Austin reviewed the By-Laws and incorporated minor changes.

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BOARD RECOMMENDATIONS AND/OR ACTION:

Bertram moved and Tinnin seconded to adopt the City of Burton Planning Commission By-Laws and Rules of Procedures. Motion carried 6-0.

*2. City of Burton Planning Commission Annual Report.*

Mr. Grantner said the report done by Mrs. Adams gives the number of Applications and Site Plan Review's, the number of approved cases, cancelled meetings and the number of members absent. He reminded the Board to call if they will be unable to attend a meeting.

*3. Revisit Master Plan*

Mr. Grantner said the Master Plan should be revisited every five years.

Mr. Strasser said the Plan would review the City's population, genders, household size and vacant houses. He did not think a study would be useful at this time, due to the poor economy and other factors, but suggested it be revisited when the County gets back on its feet. He said the cost to redo the plan is expensive, there is ample residential zoning and new subs aren't fully developed.

The Board agreed the current Master Plan was sufficient for the time being.

Mr. Strasser was asked to confirm with Attorney Austin that the Master Plan was adopted appropriately.

Mr. Strasser referred to the zoning map being in different colors and a hindrance to people such as himself that have difficulty seeing those colors.

The next regularly scheduled meeting will be held on **Tuesday, April 14, 2009, at 6:00 P.M.**
